## A Social Justice Seder

Every Peysakh Seder reenacts the story of our people's bitter slavery and sweet freedom in its own way. At the same time, we stand together as one Jewish community to recall our past, celebrate the present, and commit to making the future a better and more beautiful place. *This Peysakh, we remember that people are still held in the bonds of oppression and poverty — and we pledge to elevate those issues at our Seder table and in our everyday lives.*

Amid the abundance in our country, 10 million working people live below the poverty line and cannot meet their basic needs. The Workmen's Circle is helping to change that through our active role in the Fight for \$15, a nationwide movement organized by and for low-wage workers. *Together, we're advocating for a minimum wage of at least \$15 per hour and the right to join a union.*

As Jews, we have always aligned with the downtrodden, the outcast and the poor, inspired by the Exodus passage: "And you will not wrong or oppress a stranger for you were strangers in the land of Egypt." *Today's wage crisis calls for a Jewish response that advances social and economic justice through a lens of Jewish culture and activism, and we are pleased to be a leader in that fight.*

Please add these empty Seder plates to your Seder table as a reminder during the Peysakh story that you and your community are laboring for equality, fairness, and compassion for all.
